Deacon Ebenezer Batchelder was ^{the} fourth generation from Rev. Stephen Bachiler who was

born in England in 1561 and emigrated to America in about 1632. Rev. Stephen resided in Lynn Mass., Hampton N. H. and returned to Hackney England, where he died in 1660, and was the paternal ancestor of all the Batchelders who settled in London N. H. previous to the time when London was set off from Canterbury in 1773.

My dear Mr. Lyford, - I enclose herewith
what there is of the Batchelder genealogy.

There are two distinct families of Batchelders
connected with Canterbury, the first of
which were the three brothers mentioned in
your letter of July 30, viz, - Ebenezer, Richard and
Nathaniel who settled in the east part of
the town probably previous to 1773 and who
belong to the Laudon family. The father of
these three brothers was named Deacon Ebenezer
and I have given all of his children including
the above three. Please be careful not to
confound this Dea Ebenezer or his son Ebenezer
with Seray's father, whose name was also Ebenezer
and of another family. Unfortunately Mr.
Pierce has failed to trace the descendants
of these three brothers, so that I have
nothing to show if David M. Clough and
Albert Ames married the daughters of
Ebenezer, but I will call your attention to

the fact that Ebenezer was born in 1746 and Col. David M. Clough must have been an older man than I have supposed if he married this Ebenezer's daughter. Of course it is possible that this Ebenezer had a daughter born to him when he was fifty years old or even older, and this would have been necessary in order for her to have been young enough to have married Col. Clough. I imagine Col. Clough was born between 1800 and 1810, as I remember of going to his funeral when I was a boy about twelve years old. It would be more reasonable to assume that there was an Ebenezer 3rd who was a son of Ebenezer born in 1746 and that it was a daughter of this Ebenezer 3rd who married Col. Clough, but this is only supposition which is always dangerous to rely on, and if you have the date of Col. Clough's birth, which may be earlier than I think, you will be able to judge much better than I. I regret that

I am unable to do so little for you on the genealogy of these three brothers' descendants, but as they were included in Landon when that town was set off, it may not be of great importance to have their descendants.

There were other Landon Batchelders who were connections of these three brothers and who are very fully described by Pierce and if there is anything regarding them that you would like I will be glad to send it.

I will write you another letter about Leray's family so as not to confuse you.

My dear Mr. Lyford;

The purpose of this letter is to call your attention to the genealogy of Leray Batchelder's family whose father Ebenezer was born in ^{Canterbury} ~~Vermont~~ ^{1797 Mar. 6.} in 1800 ~~and who~~ ~~probably settled in Canterbury about 1820,~~ as you will notice he was married in 1821 to Elizabeth Kimball who was born in Canterbury in 1802.

In your letter of July 28 you mention that the Batchelders disappear from the tax list after Laudon was set off in 1773, and even there were none there in the Census of 1790. This is all good evidence and probably true and is in thorough accord with the genealogical account of them. You will probably, however, find Batchelders in the Census of 1820 or 1830 and these would be Leray's father Ebenezer if in 1820, and the 1830 Census would probably include Leray's two

brothers, Silas and John.

The descendants of this branch were few and I have included them all. Leray had no children and John, his brother, had 2 sons George C. and Henry Victor ~~only one child~~. His brother Silas you will notice was the most prolific.

Leray's oldest sister Pamela married a ^{Canterbury} ~~Canterbury~~ man named Matthews; another married Philip Clough whom you probably know and ~~who had no children~~ ^{2 died in infancy} ~~that I know of;~~ the third sister married ^{Dan W.} ~~David~~ Morrill whose children are mentioned. Leray married Susan Clough who was a sister to Philip Clough.

I hope I have made everything plain, and in order to do so I have taken considerable space and perhaps repeated some.

Do not hesitate to write at anytime for I enjoy this work.

I will keep the Batchelder genealogy for

a few weeks; in case you needed any further information I would have it handy.
