William Brown moved to Canterbury soon after marriage, cleared the land and settled on what is now known ^{as} the John Nelson farm about 1 mile east of Shaker Village where he resided until his death. He was an industrious man and by his economy and industry gathered to himself and family an ample supply of this world's goods. He was staunchly religious and he and his wife were baptized January 1-1820 by Elder Obediah C. Morrill.
