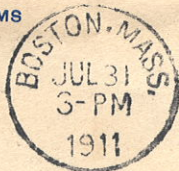

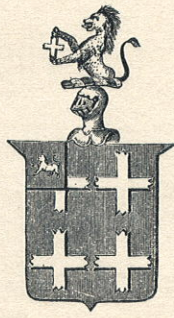
Mrs Martha (Foster) Clough (b. 1770)
