Moses Fellows fought in the battle
of Bunker Hill in Col. Stark's
regiment which was stationed
at the rail fence a bullet of

of the enemy carried away his powder horn and with his last charge of powder having no bullet he fired his ram-rod.

After the battle he was stationed at Winter Hill near Boston until Sept-8' 1775 he went to Cambridge in Capt Dearborn's Co and joined the expedition against Quebec under Benedict-Arnold.

When the attack was made on Quebec he was one of the sixty men who followed Capt Morgan to within ~~twenty~~ ^{thirty} rods of the Palace Gate and discharged ~~five~~ ^{five} mortars ~~into~~ the city. About the middle of January he returned ^{to Salisbury} home as his term of enlistment had

expired in Apr 1777 he reenlisted
as Sergeant in, Col Alexander
Scammells Regiment & went to Ft.
Ticonderoga as garrison and staid
until driven from thence by Burgoyne
retreating with the rest of the
American forces. he joined General
Stark about Aug 10 and fought at
the battle of Bennington afterwar
he went to Bemis Heights and was
with the American forces at the
battle of Saratoga, from thence he
went to White Marsh & joined Gen
Washington & spent the dreadful
winter at Valley Forge, he was in
the battle of Red Bank and captured
a British soldier with a horse afterward
selling the horse for forty dollars

he was with Gen Sullivan in his expedition against the Iroquois Indians afterward going into winter-quarters at Morristown where the suffering equalled if not exceeded Valley Forge. In the spring his time of enlistment having expired he was honorably discharged at West Point Apr 20 1786 and returned to his home in Salisbury

He learned when a youth the shoe makers trade from taking the hide from the creature to finishing the boot or shoe. He worked at his trade most of his life beside farming. He was a member of the Congregational Church and an ^{active} member.
